

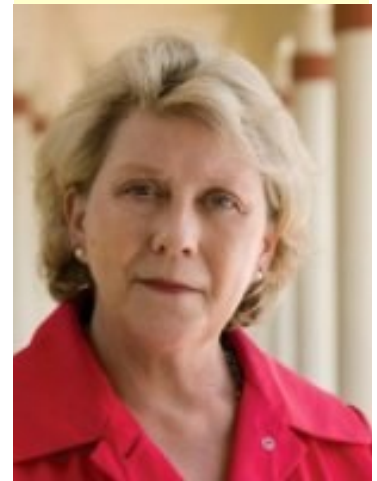

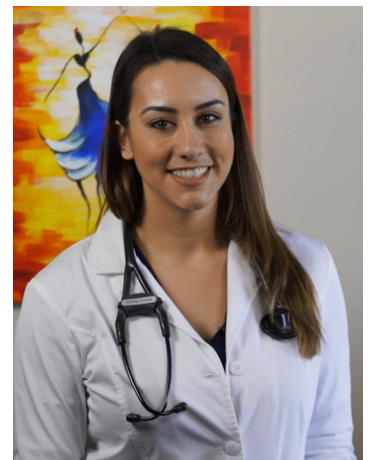


**NATALIE ROBLES**

**Natalie Robles** became a PAL kid in 2000 when she was 11 years old. At the time, she was raised in a single parent household and was lacking positive influence. Natalie says, "PAL provided me with fun, safe activities with other kids my age that I could relate to. And, the officers involved served as mentors and role models to us. PAL gave me the influence I needed to keep me on the right path, and the unconditional support from all individuals involved made it possible for me to reach my full potential."

In 2008, Natalie received PAL's first college scholarship. That scholarship, in conjunction with others, allowed her to be the 1st in her family to be accepted to a university. She received her Bachelor's Degree from CalPoly Pomona and later got her Masters in Physician Assistant Studies from Touro University Nevada-School of Osteopathic Medicine.

Natalie has volunteered in local hospitals, provided medical aid at local community events/fundraisers, worked for several years as an EMT, and was recently promoted to the Lead Physician Assistant at Olympia Medical Center, Emergency Department.

Oakland Police Department. In 2015, Julio returned to San Mateo and began working as an officer for the San Mateo Police Department.

This year, Officer Jolivette was selected as one of SMPD's newest Motor Officers and Ms. Ramirez is currently the Principal of Fiesta Gardens International Elementary School.

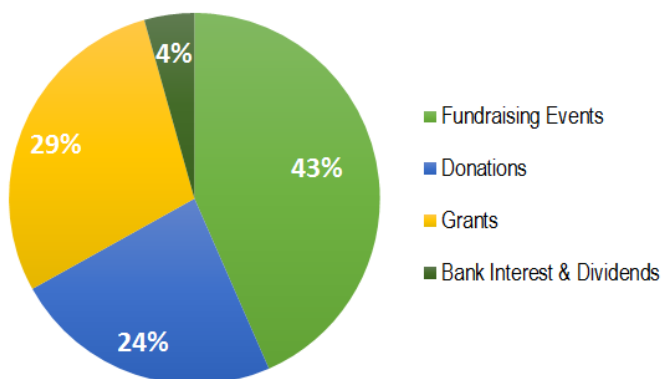

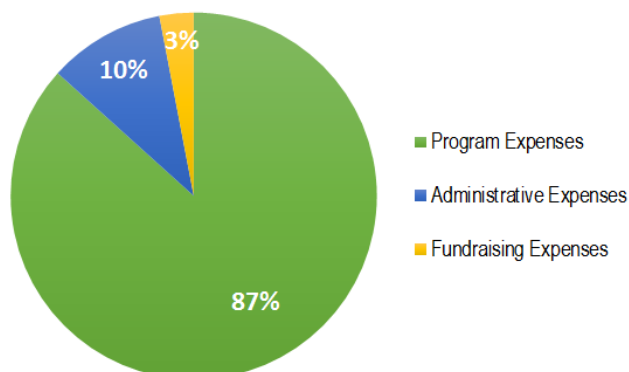
# PAL Financial Summary

Revenue



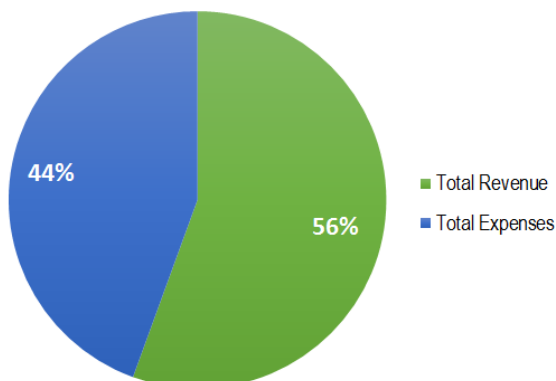
We are 67% dependent on community support.

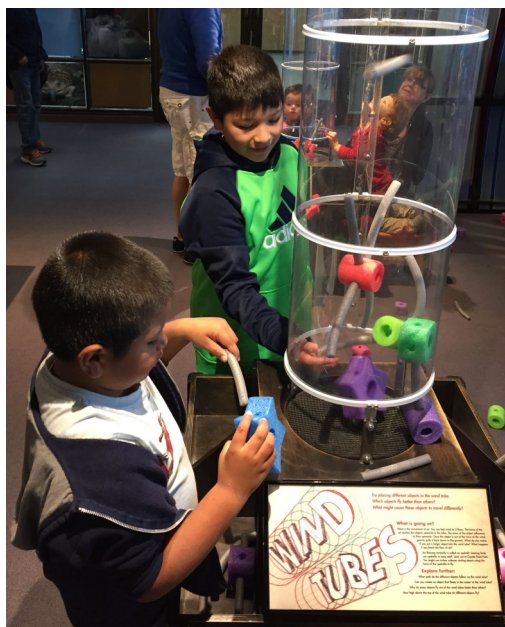

Working with the schools and social services, we ensure our kids have what they need to be successful.

## 1st PAL San Mateo PAL 5K Run for Student Mental Health & Wellness

In 2016, PAL was approached by Aragon High School student, Olivia Enriquez, with an idea to form a partnership. Olivia has her own initiative, Stride for Awareness, and hoped to partner with us in order to host a small run/walk to bring attention to student mental health and wellness. With the inception of PAL's Non-Runners Run Club, we had our own interest in hosting a run, so with matching goals, we moved forward to turn our ideas into reality.

The month of May is Mental Health Awareness Month and a natural break between PAL's signature fundraisers, making it the perfect time to host this 5K. Sunday, May 21, 2017 was selected as the date and we decided to follow in San Mateo Rotary's footsteps and hold the race at Seal Point Park.

To make more of an impact, we set out to host a Speaker Session the day before the race (Saturday, May 20, 2017), featuring psychologists, teens, and other experts who could talk to audience members about coping skills, resources available, and share personal stories pertaining to student mental health. This was coupled with a packet pick-up at the Martin Luther King Center.

The morning of the run was beautiful. We had music and Barre 3 provided a pre and post stretch to our runners. With the help of Frank Durso from A Runner's Mind, we were able to chip-time this race and had the course certified with USTAF (United States Track and Field).
