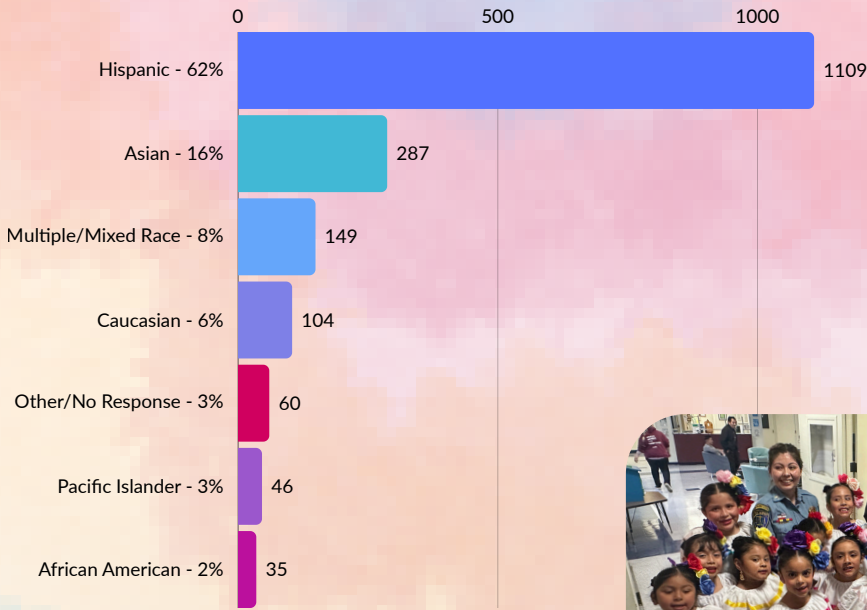

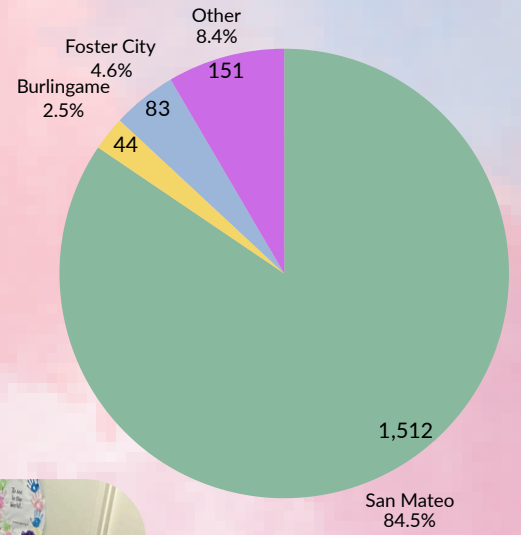

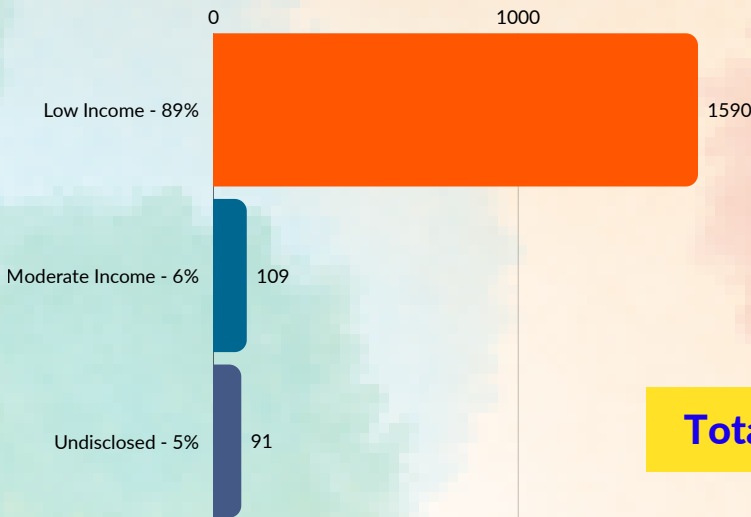
### PAL Members By Race



### PAL Members By City

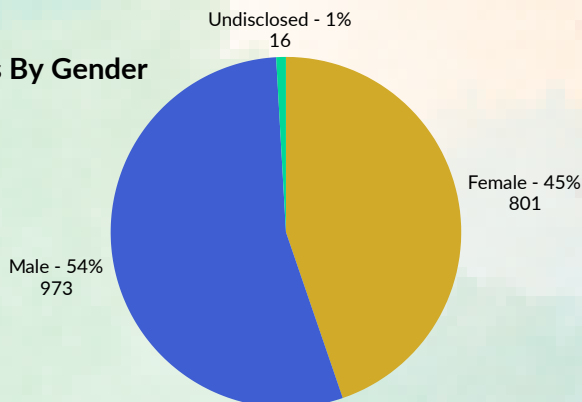


### PAL Family Income Levels

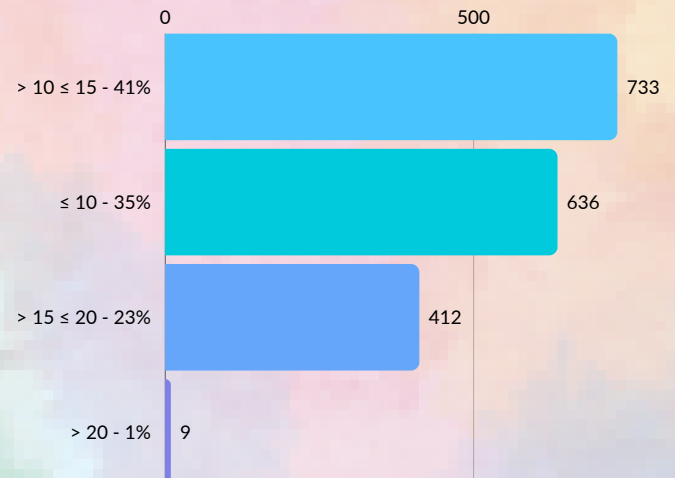

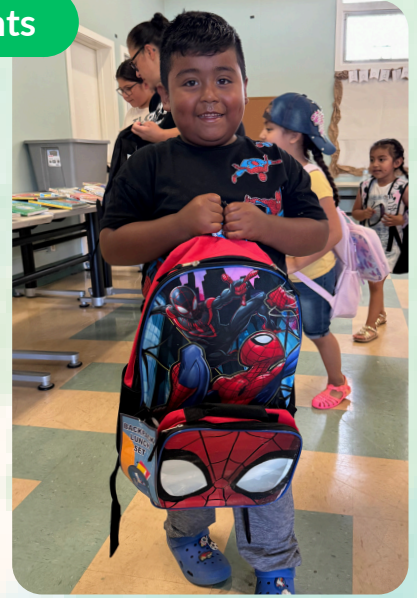

San Mateo PAL proudly announces that Youth Service Officer Allison Adle and her therapy K9 partner, Rookie, received the 2025 National Association of School Resource Officers (NASRO) Safety and Support Companion Award at the national conference in Texas. Since becoming the city's first therapy dog in 2021, Rookie has positively impacted more than 16,000 students and supported over 2,500 youth through innovative programs like Rookie's Room. Beyond schools, Rookie also provides emotional support for child victims in court and comfort for officers and community members alike. This national recognition celebrates Officer Adle and Rookie's compassion, professionalism, and lasting impact on San Mateo's youth and community.

## Police Explorer Program - Post 211



The San Mateo Police Explorer Program is an exceptional opportunity for youth ages 14 to 20 years old to engage with their community and gain valuable insight into law enforcement careers. Explorers contribute significant volunteer hours each year, supporting community events, public safety and Police Department operations, demonstrating their commitment to service. The program emphasizes the development of leadership, confidence, and a sense of responsibility, providing participants with life skills that extend beyond law enforcement. The program is led by Police Officers who dedicate their time and expertise to mentoring and guiding these future leaders, instilling in them a strong sense of duty and professionalism. ### Keep Up the Great Work, Post 211!

The San Mateo Police Department Explorers Post 211 was awarded the 2024 Explorer Post of the Year at the annual Council event. Post 211 collectively volunteered 4,070 hours in the community, and they placed within the top 3 at the annual ExCon Competition held in Las Vegas. For the second year in a row, Post 211 also partnered with the U.S. Marine Corps Toys for Tots program, helping sort and organize toys to bring joy to hundreds of families in need during the holidays.

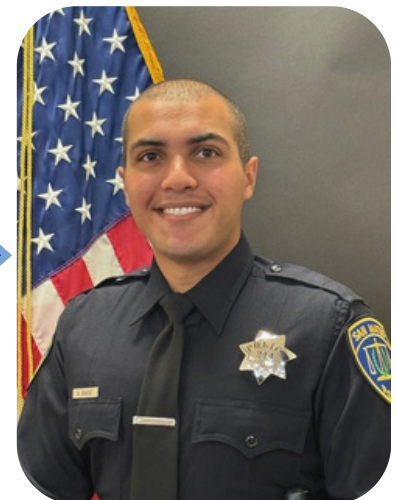
In every aspect—whether in competition, community service, leadership, or training support—San Mateo Police Department Explorer Post 211 has exemplified the highest standards of the Law Enforcement Exploring program. Their accomplishments in 2024 reflect a deep commitment to service, excellence, and leadership development.



### Explorer of the Year - Alfred Khayat

San Mateo native **Alfred Khayat** embodies the mission of the San Mateo Police Explorer Program and PAL in shaping future law enforcement leaders.

Since joining the Explorer Program in June 2022, Alfred has demonstrated exceptional service and leadership—competing twice in the National “Excon” Competitions in Las Vegas, serving as a Youth Staff Redshirt for two Explorer Academies, joining the Honor Guard Team, and earning the rank of Explorer Captain. He contributed nearly 1,000 volunteer hours to his community, and has led several PAL activities, including the summer field trips.



His dedication led to his hiring as a Community Service Officer in 2023, and most recently, his graduation from the police academy and appointment as a San Mateo Police Officer.

Alfred’s journey from an Explorer to sworn Officer highlights how PAL and the Explorer Program inspire youth through mentorship, discipline, and purpose—creating clear pathways to careers in public service.

# Pathways to College and Careers

PAL continues to empower youth to take their next steps into adulthood by helping first-generation students overcome financial barriers through scholarships and mentorship. These awards ease college costs while recognizing each student's hard work and potential. At the same time, PAL supports youth pursuing skilled trades, apprenticeships, and vocational pathways. By supporting both academic and career-focused goals, PAL ensures that every young person has the tools and encouragement needed to build a meaningful and self-sustaining future.

# Where Are They Now?



Guadalupe Hernandez is a proud alum of the PAL Scholarship Program and a shining example of how early support can shape a future. She first connected with PAL as a child in 2015 when she received her first bicycle from PAL, a moment that left a lasting impression and introduced her to a positive side of law enforcement.

In 2020, she joined PAL as an Explorer, deepening her involvement in community service and leadership opportunities. Today, Guadalupe is studying Administration of Criminal Justice and Sociology and has earned Honors status at the College of San Mateo. Guadalupe hopes to build a full-time career with the San Mateo Police Department, and has credited the PAL Scholarship for not only easing her financial burden, but also giving her a strong sense of belonging, valuable professional experience, and mentorship that continues to guide her through life.

Her favorite PAL memory is recreating a photo in 2024 with the same officers who gave her that first bike years ago, a full-circle moment that reflects her journey of growth, gratitude, and commitment to giving back.



**Alexander Carmona** is a PAL Scholarship recipient who exemplifies drive, discipline, and dedication to his goals. He attended California State University-East Bay, where he majored in Criminal Justice and graduated in 2025, an especially proud moment as he completed his degree an entire year early.

His involvement with PAL began through the Police Explorer Program, which gave him early exposure to law enforcement and leadership. Alexander shares that the PAL Scholarship played a key role in his journey, allowing him to focus fully on his education and giving him the confidence and motivation to keep pushing toward his goals.

When asked what advice he'd give to future applicants, Alexander encourages young people to cherish their journey and take advantage of opportunities like the PAL Scholarship, reminding them that "time really flies." Alexander plans to attend the police academy after graduation and continue pursuing a career in public service.



**Nicole Alvarez**, a distinguished alumna of the San Mateo Police Department's Post 211 Explorer Program, exemplifies the impact of early mentorship and community service. She served as an Explorer for three years, gaining hands-on experience and developing leadership skills that would shape her future. During her time with the program, Nicole held multiple roles, including Assistant Squad Leader and Media Specialist, where she demonstrated commitment to teamwork, discipline, and civic responsibility.

As her time in the program progressed, Nicole began to reflect on her long-term goals. Through thoughtful conversations with her family, peers, and the Post 211 staff, she reaffirmed her childhood aspiration to serve in law enforcement or public service. Ultimately, she made the decision to enlist in the United States Marine Corps, viewing it as an opportunity to expand her skill set and continue serving her country in a new capacity.

Nicole began her military journey in June 2023 and is currently stationed at Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton in California, where she serves as an Administrative Specialist. Her choice to join the Marine Corps was influenced by the encouragement of family role models and the branch's commitment to excellence. Despite the challenges of transitioning from the Explorer Program to military life, she credits the strong support network at Post 211 for helping her navigate the change.

Now approaching her two-year milestone in the Marine Corps, Nicole remains deeply connected to the Explorer Program and continues to give back whenever possible. Her story reflects the long-term value of youth engagement programs and the lasting influence they can have on shaping future leaders.

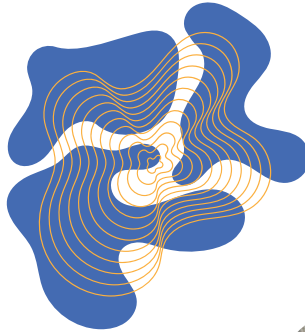
# Reflections from Our Kids, Coaches and Parents

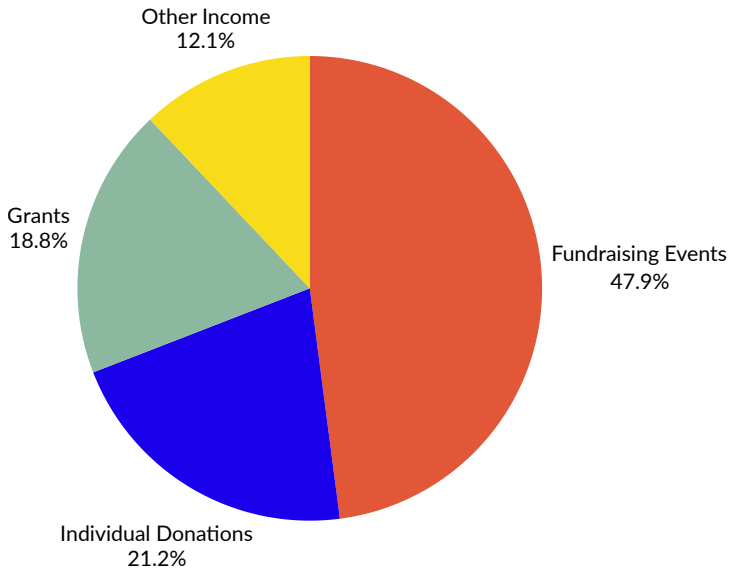

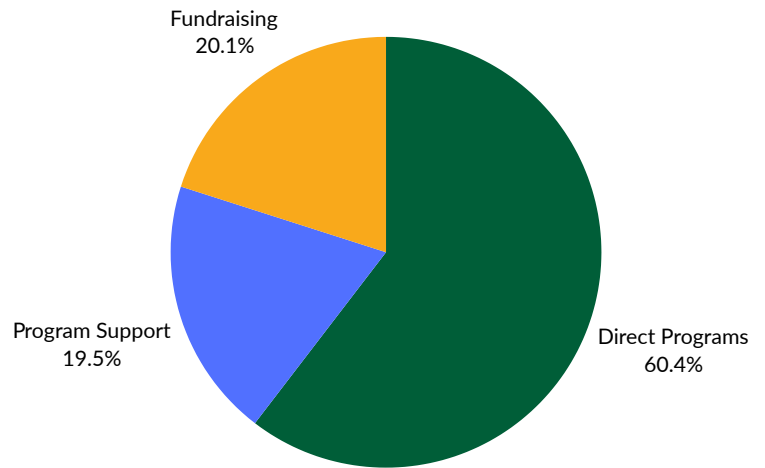

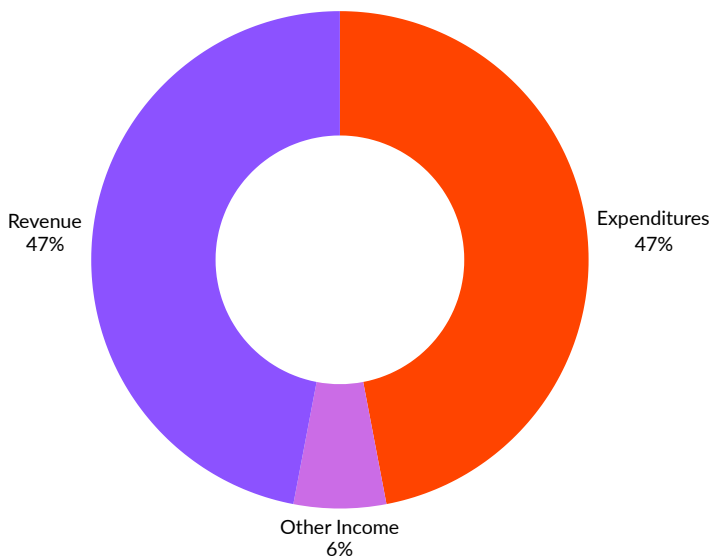
## Revenue
