Our Mission

Since 1997, San Mateo PAL has provided recreational, educational, and leisure activities at little or no cost to thousands of San Mateo youth. Supported by a volunteer Board of Directors and staff consisting of Police Officers, Parks and Recreation Staff, and City Employees, the San Mateo Police Activities League is building a stronger and safer community through kids -our most valuable asset.



The San Mateo Police Activities League (SMPAL) was established in 1997 as a collaboration between the San Mateo Police Department and the San Mateo Parks & Recreation Department to reduce juvenile delinquency and develop our youth. San Mateo PAL provides high quality developmental, recreational, and educational activities to the youth of San Mateo and surrounding communities at little or no cost for our youth who otherwise might not have these opportunities. Membership is FREE! San Mateo PAL utilizes police officers and recreational leaders as coaches, teachers, and mentors to thousands of youth, families, and the community. San Mateo PAL believes that by fostering positive interactions and developing lasting relationships between police officers and youth, we are developing better citizens for the future. PAL is a non-profit organization supported by a dedicated Board of Directors comprised of many corporate and community leaders whose fundraising efforts and other support ensure that our youth will be provided a strong foundation for their future.

Partnering with the San Mateo County Sheriff's Activities League (SAL), we offer this program to over 100 youth, ranging from 6-18 years old. This program serves youth from San Mateo and neighboring communities, keeping them engaged in positive, productive activities, as well as keeping them safe and off the streets. Kudos for their great success on and off the field this season.

Additionally, we served hundreds of youth and their families at events like "Backpack Palooza," "Dia De Los Muertos," "Cinco De Mayo," and "National Night Out," just to name a few. With these events our PAL community has grown, spreading PAL's positive message.

As I go out into the community and meet so many PAL kids and families in need, I feel truly fortunate to be the "P in PAL." Thank you to PAL's amazing staff, gracious volunteers, generous donors, and the many SMPD Officers who work hard every day to fulfill our mission of "Building the Bond Between Cops & Kids."

It's hard to believe that my tenure with our Department is coming to an end this year. I can share with all of you that PAL has been one of the most important and rewarding aspects of my job as your Chief. As cops, we come into this profession to help people and make a difference - especially to those who are in need or have lost their way. What I've found over the years is that helping our kids and families is one of the most impactful and important things we can do to ensure a bright future for our community.



Over this past year, we have stayed true to our primary mission that started our PAL: "Building the Bond between Cops and Kids." Our winning partnership between our Police and Park and Recreation programs have continued to provide effective and timely programs and successful interventions for our youth in need. We have a "front row seat" every day as our staff see the challenges and choices that confront our youth and families. The truth is, we no longer just target our at-risk youth – because all of our youth are at-risk nowadays.

The landscape for our kids has become very complex and PAL serves an important role as guide and mentor for our youth and families. Our kids face social bullying, risky choices, cultural barriers, and peer pressure that know no zip code and can seem insurmountable at times. That's exactly when PAL is there for them. Our programs are designed to equip our youth with social defenses, resiliency, and 21st century skills to achieve success and build self-esteem and confidence.

We've expanded our mission to include "Keeping our kids on track, in school, and out of jail." We've added a groundbreaking pre-arrest Diversion Program as we partnered with San Mateo County Probation to keep kids out of the Juvenile Justice System. This successful program is now being replicated within the County. Whether taking them fishing, teaching them coding, expanding their horizons, or just helping them work through the consequences of bad choices, we are here for our kids! We are there on the ground and in the trenches as a lifeline with resources and support when a crisis hits a family. Working with the schools and social services, we ensure our kids have what they need to be successful.

All of these enhanced services and programs would simply NOT be possible without the amazing support of our donors, sponsors, and supporters. Please take a look through this Year in Review and note all of the donors that contribute to our PAL. Their continued support provides the vital lifeline for our kids and families and we are grateful. We simply could not provide these services without this continued support and I thank each and every one of our PAL's "Pals!"

A Vital Part of the PAL Team... School Resource Officers

School Resource Officers, also known as SRO's, are assigned to the public middle schools and high schools in San Mateo. School Resource Officers are educators, mentors and safety advocates, not just law enforcement officers. They play a vital role in strengthening the "Bond Between Cops and Kids," and what better place than in school and during after-school programs! SRO's are in a perfect position to identify kids at risk or in need of support. Our three School Resource Officers are also embedded in several of our PAL programs like:

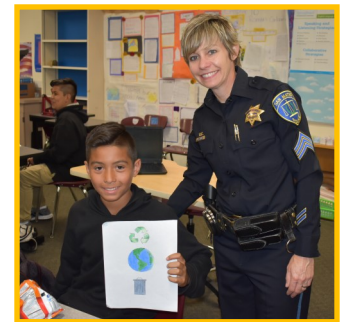
Diversion

This intervention program engages first time low-level youth offenders and is designed to divert these youth out of the formal juvenile justice system. School Resource Officers also help identify youth engaged in dangerous and/or criminal activity and refer them to prevent escalating negative behaviors. This program provides youth with individual and family mental health counseling, community service, bi-weekly educational classes, parenting classes, and school check-ins. The bond formed between our SRO's and youth remains long after the program ends.



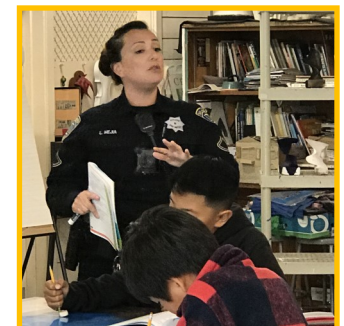
High School Outreach Programs

Our SRO's help to identify kids in school that would benefit from being engaged in a variety of after school programs. From fitness class, hip hop dance, basketball, yoga, soccer, ropes courses or fashion design, they are side by side with the students and the bond they build reaches the child's family, peer group, and community as a whole.



G.R.E.A.T.

Gang Resistance Education and Training is taught to every 6th grade student in the San Mateo public schools and our SRO's provide over 500 hours (13 weeks) of important decision-making curriculum and prevention training to them. They give students the opportunity to ask hard questions in a safe space and often times this open line of communication continues through high school.



Community Outreach Events

SRO's regularly participate in many of PAL's community outreach events. They have been seen dancing with our Ballet Folkloric dancers, giving gifts away as Mrs. Claus during PAL's holiday events, handing out backpacks at Backpack Palooza, making crafts at PAL family nights, or having a meal with youth and families at Dia de los Muertos or Cinco de Mayo events. SRO's are part of the magical police in PAL!



Darren Kelley, PAL Board Chair, (pictured on left) has been an advocate for our local youth and families for many years. He is committed to supporting PAL's embedded services, positive mentorship, and providing all youth access to our low cost youth development programming.

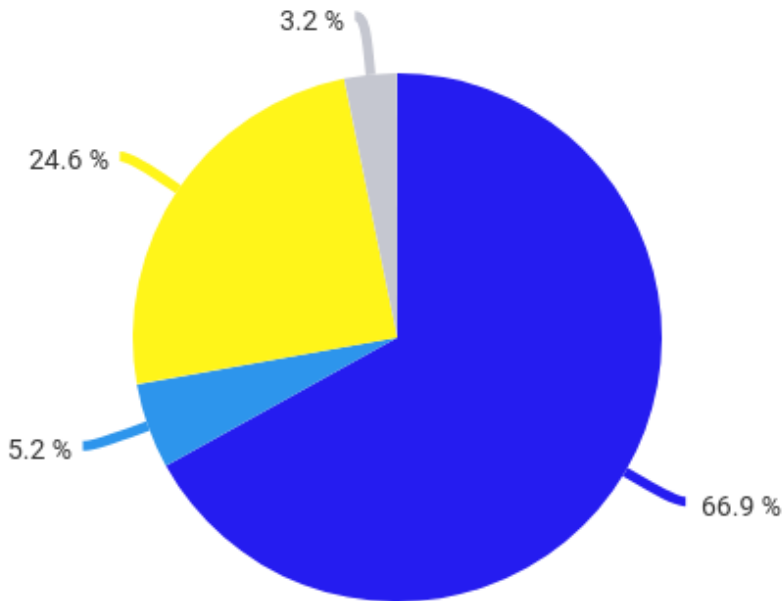

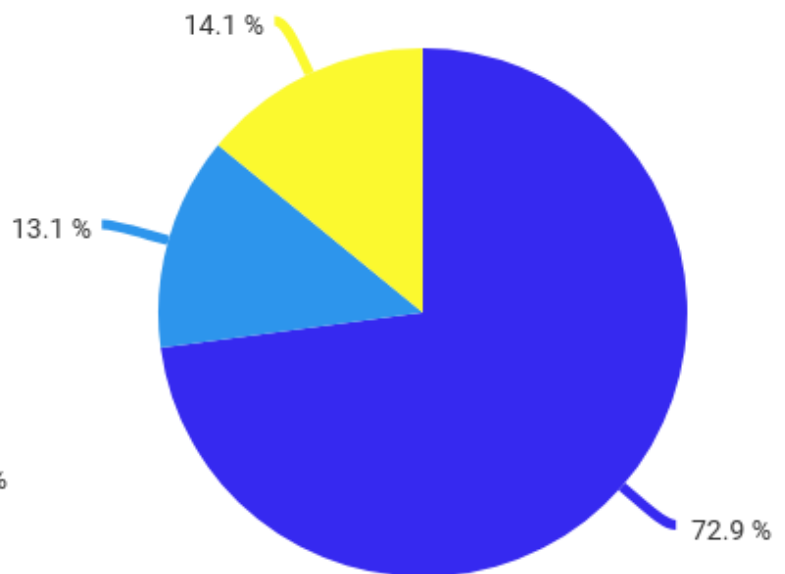
July 1, 2018 to June 30, 2019

Revenue



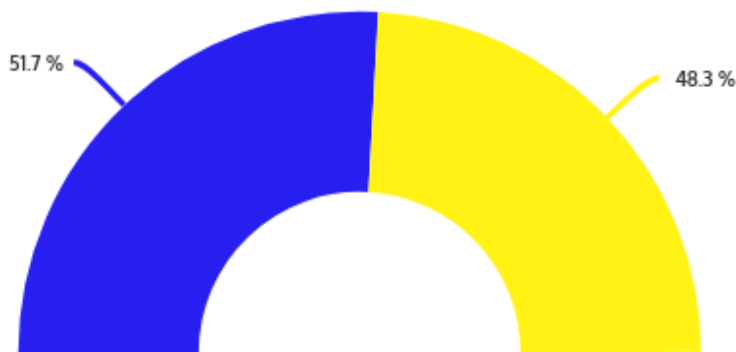

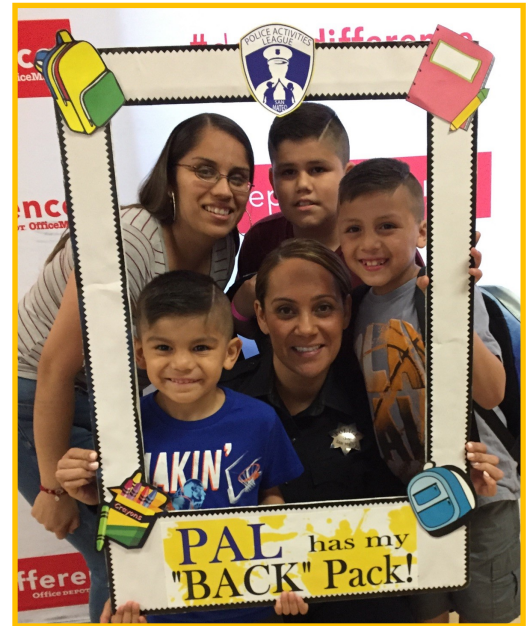
“Building the Bond Between Cops & Kids”... One Child at a Time, One Opportunity at a Time!

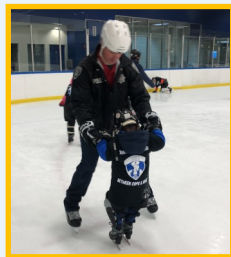
