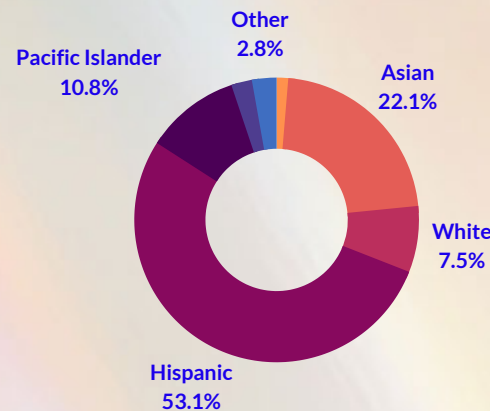
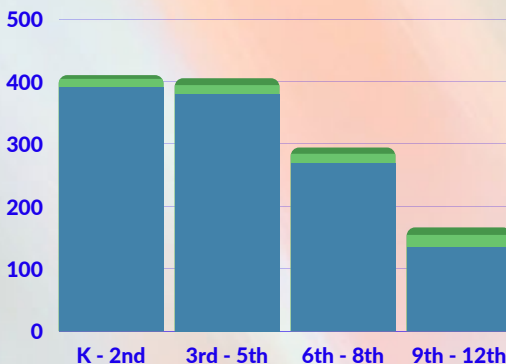
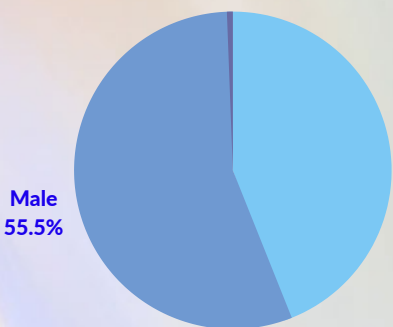

# The "P" in PAL



The San Mateo Police Department (SMPD) believes in a collaborative approach to policing. This community policing model is equal parts community and law enforcement, which keeps San Mateo safe, vibrant, and healthy. San Mateo Police Activities League is a big part of this effort.

It is a proactive vehicle for SMPD to positively impact the community by supporting the youth and families from the ground up. Building trust, establishing relationships, creating a safer community, and making a difference in the lives of our youth is the goal.



# Police Explorer Program - Post 211



Police Explorers are uniformed youth community service volunteers aged 14-20 years old, who help serve the community while developing critical life and leadership skills through the law enforcement experience. The goal is to prepare them for their future academic and professional careers.

San Mateo PAL sponsors this program under the supervision of a team of Police Explorer Advisors made up of sworn and non-sworn police staff. Explorers participate in a 9-week Explorer Academy, must do 10 hours of community service per month, attend bi-weekly meetings where they receive behind the scenes training on a law enforcement curriculum, conduct vacation house checks, attend ride-alongs with police officers, go on regular team-building outings, and volunteer at PAL, PD, and city sponsored community events. ## Rookie's First Year on the Job

What a year it's been for Rookie and his handler Officer Allison Adle! From traveling to Ohio at the end of 2021 to obtain Rookie's certifications to Oklahoma this past October to obtain additional training and certifications, it's safe to say these two have been quite busy this last year.

Officer Adle and Rookie have been spotted all over San Mateo/San Mateo County visiting schools, attending PAL & community events, responded to over 100 calls for service, and provided support and comfort to those who need it. Officer Adle says, "watching the happiness, joy and comfort Rookie brings to people every day" is her favorite part of being Rookie's handler. People will greet them and simply say, "Rookie, I needed you so much today" or "Rookie, I'm so glad you're here." By the tail wags, we can see Rookie is happy to be there too. He thrives on human interaction and instantly changes the mood in a room with his adorableness, sweet personality, and calming temperament.

Officer Adle and Rookie have also made mental health and wellness a top priority this past year. In May 2022, Off. Adle partnered with the wellness teams at each public high school in San Mateo to create Rookie's Room. Through each school's online wellness portal, students are able to sign-up for a 15-minute mental health check-in with Rookie and Off. Adle. It's been a great way for them to connect with students and build relationships and have provided support to 120 students.

## **This is Franklin's Story...**

Growing up, going fishing with San Mateo PAL was one of the few constants Summer after Summer. No matter what else I had going on, I always made sure I was able to go on at least a few trips every year. As a child I loved being out on the water, seeing the California coastline from a different perspective, and of course, catching fish. As an adult now, I am forever grateful for the experiences and mentorship throughout my time in the PAL program.

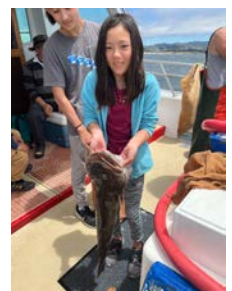
Fishing brought a lot of fun, unique experiences, and lessons for me. It was so much fun being around other kids and sharing in the excitement of what someone might be bringing up out of the water. Even the group disappointment when it was nothing was fun. Of course, going fishing was much more than just showing up on a boat. I had to learn how to go to sleep early so I could be up at around 5:30 to head to the police station. It was a great test of patience when the fish simply weren't biting and how to persevere through it. We all showed compassion for each other when my fellow fisher-kids caught something big and empathy when others had not. I learned how to be humble when I won the (many) biggest fish trophies (or gracious, when I didn't). In addition, my parents absolutely loved that I was bringing home fresh fish for the family. It helped foster a sense of contribution to the family from a young age and a bit of pride when we had fish that night, "I caught that!"

When I got older and more experienced, I was able to start sharing with the younger, new kids my love of fishing. The adults would space themselves around the boat so they could help the kids around them, and I was able to take one of those posts. Seeing the joy at a kid's first fish-on, or the first time they managed to handle one themselves after some coaching and encouragement was transformative in how I approach teaching to this day. Through these trips, I learned some sense of responsibility, but I'll never forget the day that I felt I was truly an "adult". I knew I was part of the "team" when Officer Migita invited me to ride with him in the old equipment van, where only adults could ride.

For the last 22 years, PAL has been teaching boys and girls to fish on both the ocean and the bay. These trips are one of our highlights of the PAL program because it promotes team building, hard work, and it exemplifies the PAL mission, which is "Building the Bond Between Cops & Kids".

Our fishing trips have always been led and supervised by officers who dedicate their time and support to providing a memorable experience. Even in retirement, Officers Paul, Ralph, and Pat continue to take our PAL kids out to fish!

This past summer we were able to have 6 trips for salmon fishing and crabbing.

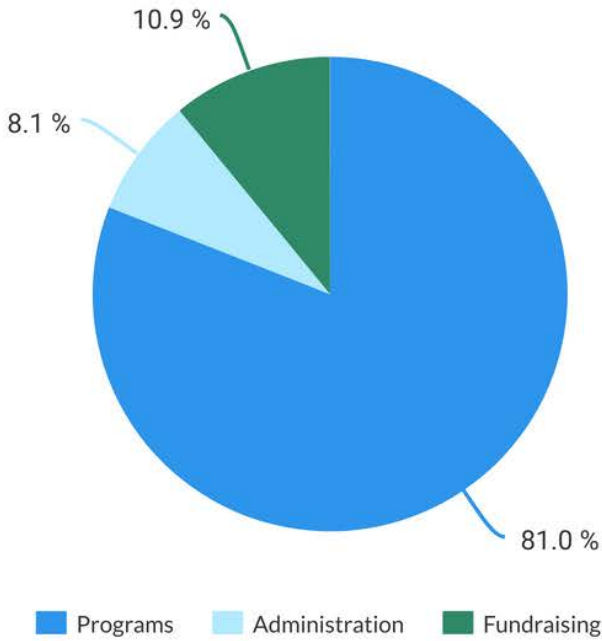

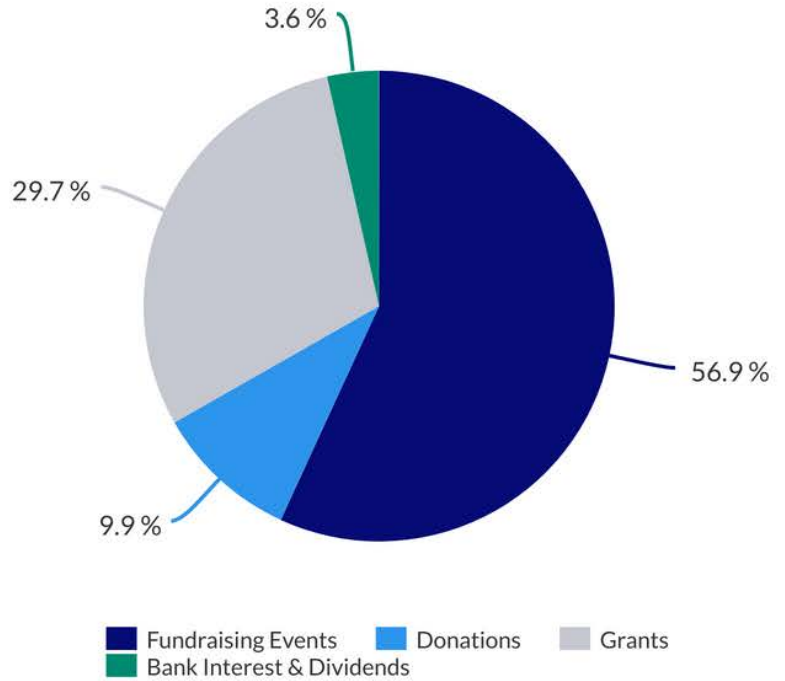

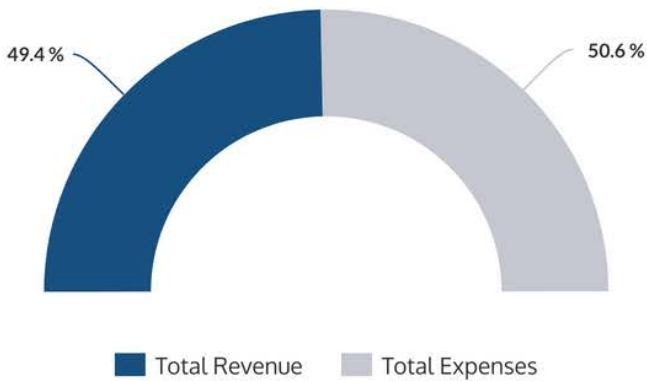
## Revenue
