Supported by a volunteer Board of Directors and staff consisting of Police Officers, Parks and Recreation Staff, and City Employees, the San Mateo Police Activities League is building a stronger and safer community through kids -our most valuable asset.

The San Mateo Police Activities League (SMPAL) was established in 1997 as a collaboration between the San Mateo Police Department and the San Mateo Parks & Recreation Department to reduce juvenile delinquency and develop our youth. San Mateo PAL provides high quality developmental, recreational, and educational activities to the youth of San Mateo and surrounding communities at little or no cost for our youth who otherwise might not have these opportunities. Membership is FREE! San Mateo PAL utilizes police officers and recreational leaders as coaches, teachers, and mentors to thousands of youth, families, and the community. San Mateo PAL believes that by fostering positive interactions and developing lasting relationships between police officers and youth, we are developing better citizens for the future. PAL is a non-profit organization supported by a dedicated Board of Directors comprised of many corporate and community leaders whose fundraising efforts and other support ensure that our youth will be provided a strong foundation for their future.

PAL EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

*What an extraordinary time this has been at PAL! This Annual Report will give you a glimpse into the unique collaboration we have among the San Mateo Police, San Mateo Parks & Recreation, and San Mateo PAL Board of Directors. You'll witness that we go into the city's most underserved communities and provide recreational and learning experiences for children in need while **Building the Bond Between Cops & Kids**. Join us as we reflect on this past year.*



PAL started the year with our regular programming; focused on providing mentoring, enrichment activities, prevention & intervention programs, and life skills to our youth. PAL increased physical activity and teamwork classes through numerous sports programs; improved mental and emotional health with access to a therapist and counseling; and provided an environment where positive relationships with our police officers could be fostered.

We hosted several culturally rich community events and family nights, launched an exciting new high school outreach program, and welcomed the year 2020 with an over the top "PAL Lights & Sirens" fundraising dinner. Then the COVID-19 pandemic arrived. Once it hit our community, all in-person programming was suspended. PAL had to re-assess programming and we focused our attention on identifying the needs of the community. Many of our PAL families were faced with traumatic situations like the loss of employment and income, school closures, and fear of the unknown. Our main priority was to make sure our PAL families had the necessities needed during the shelter-in-place orders. One way we did that was by immediately pivoting from youth programming and launched a food distribution program we named, "Food for Families," also known as "OPERATION SMPAL CARES". With the assistance of community partners like Second Harvest Food Bank, Samaritan House and Esposto's Catering, as well as numerous donations of hot food from area businesses, PAL was able to provide and deliver much needed "Food Pantry Boxes" full of basic essentials, ensuring families could keep food on the table. Our San Mateo police officers and Parks & Rec staff were right there acting as safety nets for the community.

*I am proud to say that during the course of 20 weeks, PAL was able to distribute over 2,700 pantry boxes to the community and successfully served over 300 needy families. None of this would have been possible without the support of our amazing PAL Board of Directors and all of our generous donors. **Thank you!***

*As PAL's Executive Director, I have been honored by the overwhelming amount of support and outpouring of love and generosity that all of **YOU** have shown throughout this past year. Our PAL families have expressed much appreciation during these difficult and uncertain times, and they will never forget that when they needed us most, PAL was there! San Mateo Police Officers & PAL Staff have gone above and beyond in service these past several months to serve those within the community confronted with unexpected hardships caused by COVID-19. PAL is prepared to endure the current crisis, while hearing the needs of the community, and **TOGETHER** we will emerge stronger and steadfast in our commitment to our families.*

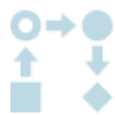
The Reason

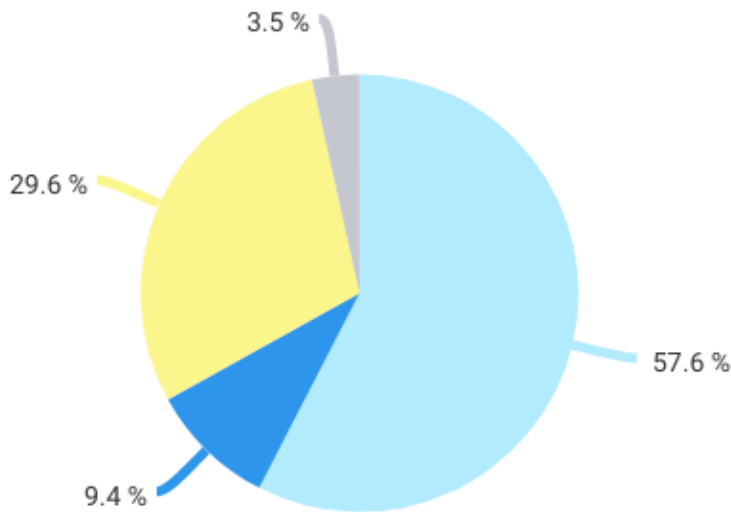
San Mateo PAL offers a free membership and low or minimum cost to all activities and events. 100% of youth and families in the community have access to PAL programming.

July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020

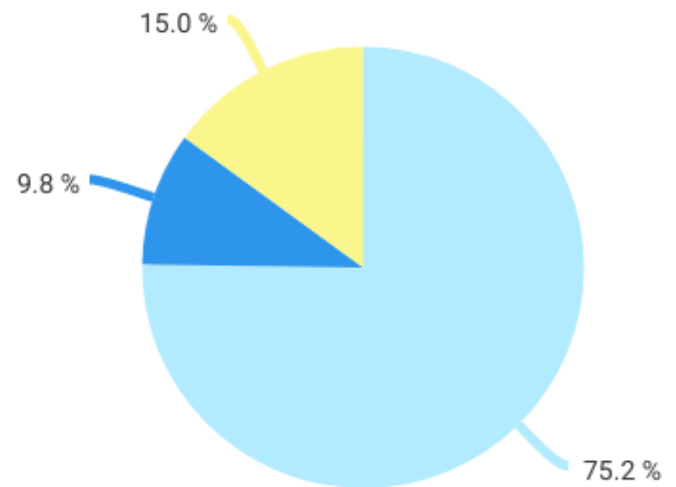

DIA DE LOS MUERTOS FESTIVAL



In October 2019, PAL hosted our first Dia de Los Muertos Festival at the Martin Luther King Jr. Center. Taking over the parking lot, we transformed it into a free, open air festival that had a street fair vibe. There were vendors, art stations where kids could decorate sugar skulls, the Mobile Rec van was there, and the San Mateo Public Library provided a book fair with free books. A very popular vendor tent was the Office Depot tent, where kids could make slime. Office Depot has been a great partner to us over the past few years and are a generous donor of our Backpack PAL-ooza event. Another area was designated as a free "Farmer's Market" where attendees could pick vegetables provided by Second Harvest Food Bank. PAL provided treats like popcorn and cotton candy.



Entertainment during the event included performances by our very own PAL Ballet Folklórico group and a Zumba demonstration by the San Mateo Parks and Recreation Department (our partner in PAL). The highlight performance of the day were Aztec dancers who performed several exciting ethnic dances to the beat of their drums. Another cool sight for the eyes was a lowrider car show.



The festival was attended by hundreds of people over the course of the day. We even had visitors from Sunrise Assisted Living, who took a field trip to join us. A beautiful altar was decorated by our Ballet Folklórico families, who helped put this event together with our PAL staff member, Gladys Privado-Pinzon.

Thank you John Smyrnos

To those who knew him, John Smyrnos will always be remembered as a man who dedicated his life to youth mentoring, along with his decades of volunteer service to the San Mateo Police Department. John, born and raised in San Mateo, wanted to give back to the City through public service. He was an entrepreneur who ran several successful businesses; but John's true passion was his 25 year membership in the San Mateo Police Reserve Unit. He was well known throughout the police department for his dedication and good judgement as a volunteer police officer. He later became the Commander of the police reserves and oversaw administration of the program in addition to being an active uniformed officer.

John was equally passionate about mentoring youth in the community. John served as past president of the Optimist Club for Youth and he also mentored teenage police cadets who were interested in exploring a police career. John was involved in the PAL program at inception and he volunteered for PAL events.

In 2002, John passed away and left a portion of his estate to San Mateo PAL. His donation funded the purchase of PAL transport vehicles and his gift keeps on giving to all the youth in the PAL program. Recently, we had two of our PAL vehicles decaled and a "Smyrnos" logo was affixed in recognition. We thought it was fitting to finally recognize John publicly for his gift. Thank you John for all you gave to both the San Mateo Police Department, San Mateo PAL, and community youth over the years.



FOOD FOR FAMILIES

While our PAL families and the community at large, faced traumatic situations with the loss of employment and income, school closures, and an unknown future due to COVID-19, our PAL staff and police officers continued to be there as a safety net.

With regular PAL programming suspended, we thought about how we could continue to provide assistance to our PAL families and what the current need was. That need was determined to be food, so that is where we put our focus.

Since the pandemic began, we have been able to distribute over 2,700 pantry kits of wholesome food and essential items to 900 people. Donations from the public allowed us to reach more than just our membership. Over 70,000 lbs of food was made available. Hot meals and groceries were provided by numerous donors including Samaritan House, Second Harvest Food Bank, Esposto's Catering, and several other organizations; whose goal was to help us feed our community. We held weekly drive-thru pickups or delivered the boxes ourselves. Everyone who received them did so with humble appreciation.

We thank all of you for helping us feed our families and community during this temporary timeout in our standard programming activities for our PAL kids. You have proven that in times of uncertainty, generosity can bring the community together. Your continued support is appreciated, now more than ever.

We do all we can to bring back the magic of the season and are grateful to those who helped us transform the ho-hum into Ho Ho Ho for our PAL families.



Shop with a Cop: In order for recipients to be selected to Shop with a Cop, we have any interested member submit an essay about a specific topic. This year's topic was "What have you done to give back to your community this year?" They must be written by hand and are the sweetest, most selfless letters that truly demonstrate the innocence of children. Twelve kids were selected and paired with officers and were able to spend \$150 at Target.



Santa Cop: Santa, Mrs. Claus, and Jingle the Elf once again hit the streets of San Mateo to deliver gifts and holiday cheer to eight families, two of which were homeless. Referred to PAL by police officers, the school district, or PAL staff, each year we reach out to the parents and plan this surprise visit. Pulling up in our vintage 1957 Plymouth Belvedere police car, we provide gifts to all members of the family, not just the individual referred to us. We make sure to have enough candy canes with us to hand out to other neighborhood kids we may see during our visits.



Brunch with Santa: We transformed the Martin Luther King Jr. Center into a Winter Wonderland for the 250 families who joined us for our annual Brunch with Santa. They rode a train, were read a story by Mrs. Claus, got their picture with Santa, and then had a delicious pancake breakfast prepared by the First Responders Lions Club.
